

School Children's Entry Rules

1. All work must be done by the exhibitor. Parents are urged to encourage their children in every way, but allow them to do the work themselves
2. All entries must be the work of the individual and at the appropriate school level
3. All baking to be saran wrapped on paper plates
4. Regulation tickets to be used. These may be obtained from your school or contact the secretary of the fair
5. Note individual age restrictions per classes
6. Only one entry per person per section
7. All exhibits to be placed in the Community Centre on Monday from 4 to 8 pm and on Tuesday from 9 am to 11 am. This includes School Exhibits. Judging to begin at 12 noon. ALL EXHIBITS MUST REMAIN UNTIL 4:30 PM ON WEDNESDAY (NO EXCEPTIONS)
8. Any section with twenty or more entries may be divided and two first prizes, two second prizes etc. may be awarded. (This does not refer to individuals with 20 or more entries overall)

#59 – Jelly Jiggles*

- 2 envelopes unflavoured gelatin, 15 ml (1 tbsp.) each
- 2 envelopes flavoured Jell-O powder (3oz. 85 g)
- 2 ½ cups boiling water

Lightly grease 9" x 13" baking pan. Set aside. Pour both the unflavoured and flavoured gelatins into a bowl and mix.

Add the boiling water to the bowl. Stir until gelatins dissolve. Pour into pan. Chill for at least 3 hours until set. Cut into shapes with cookie cutter.

#60 - Spider Cookies**

- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chipits
- 1 cup butterscotch chipits
- 2 ½ Chinese noodles (not crushed)

Put both types of chipits in large bowl. Microwave on high 2 minutes or until mixture is smooth when stirred.

Add Chinese noodles and stir to coat well.

Press 1 miniature marshmallow on cookie to represent the head.

Drop by spoonful on waxed paper. Chill

#61 – Apple Squares ***

- 2 cup sugar
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 2 Eggs
- 3 cups flour
- 2 cups chopped apples
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. cinnamon

Mix sugar, oil and eggs. Beat 3 minutes. Add flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt and cinnamon, stirring well. Add apples. Spread on greased 11” x 13” inch pan. Bake 40 minutes at 350 degree F. Sift icing sugar on top before cutting. Cut into squares while still warm.

#63 – Butterscotch Bites****

- ¾ cup (175 ml) granulated sugar
- ¼ cup (60 ml) butter or hard margarine
- 1/3 cup (75 ml) skim evaporated milk
- ½ cup (125ml) butterscotch chipits
- 1 ¾ cups (425 ml) quick cooking rolled oats (not instant)
- ¼ cup (60ml) shredded coconut

Combine the sugar, butter and evaporated milk in a bowl. Microwave, uncovered, on high for about 2 minutes until the mixture boils. Stir. Microwave on medium for 1 minute. Add the chips. Stir until melted. Mix in the rolled oats and coconut. Cover a baking sheet with waxed paper. Drop the mixture by rounded tablespoons onto the waxed paper. Chill until firm. Keep chilled. Makes about 2 dozen.

#64 – Quick black Forest Cake*****

- 1 Devil's food cake mix
- 1 cup semi-sweet Chocolate chipits
- 3 eggs
- ½ tbsp. almond flavouring
- 19 oz. cherry pie filling

Mix these five ingredients together well with a spoon. Turn into greased 9" x 13" pan. Bake preheated oven at 350 F for 45 – 50 minutes. Cool and glaze with following:

Glaze:

- ½ cup semi-sweet chocolate chipits
- 2 tbsp. milk
- 1 tbsp. butter or margarine
- ½ cup icing sugar

Microwave chipits, butter and milk or heat in sauce pan over medium heat until melted and mix well. Stir icing sugar. Spread over cooled cake.
