

Class 21 - Roots and Vegetables

All Roots and Vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor except in sections 43 and 44

Helpful Hints for showing roots and vegetables

- Roots and Vegetables are judged on quality and uniformity
- Beets should be 2 – 3" in diameter. Leave $\frac{3}{4}$ " tops on beets above crown, rubbed clean, not washed or scrubbed, root may be trimmed to 1" approximately
- Cabbage – some outer leaves removed
- Carrots – tops should be removed to $\frac{1}{2}$ " above crown. Roots should be cleaned and washed and tap roots left on
- Corn – 1/3 of the husk pulled down and silk removed, kernels well filled
- Cucumbers should be well matched, not over ripe, straight even shaped with blunt ends. Colour should be dark green, surface smooth or warty, according to variety. Leave $\frac{1}{4}$ " stem
- Cooking onions and sweet Spanish onions – do not peel or wash, just remove rough outer skin. Remove tops
- Peppers – leave $\frac{1}{2}$ " stem
- Potatoes – uniform in size, Brush clean, do not wash
- Pumpkins – stem should be left attached but trimmed
- Squash – Leave stems attached but trimmed
